Dear Mr. Cohen,

We have reviewed the investigative reports relating to TAGMET Agent David Kain and Corning Police Officer David Pryatel. We believe their conduct in fabricating a basis for the stop of Lucio Altamirano Gomez was irresponsible and unethical, and we are also troubled by the fact that other officers were aware of what was being done. Nonetheless, we are declining to charge either officer with a criminal violation for filing a false report (Pen. Code § 118.1). As you know, that section requires that the false statement be material. In light of the fact that the officers were trying to protect a confidential informant and that they did, in fact, have an unarticulated basis which would have provided probable cause for the stop, we do not believe that criminal charges are warranted.

As we discussed, we believe these reports (or a version redacted to exclude the names of suspects) should be available for discovery under *Brady v. Maryland* in future cases where the officers are witnesses. Please call me if you would like to discuss this matter further.
