Some would say a Sheriff's Posse is an out-of-date relic of the past. Well we think differently, when wanted fugitives flee a Posse was formed, which resulted in the apprehension of two career ne'er-do-wells.

A little before 8:00am this morning the Johnston County Sheriff's Office received a call of trespassers on a ranch off of State Highway 7. Upon arriving Sheriff's Sergeant Alyson Orr-Dodd made contact with Dillion Teague, which was showing signs of being under the influence of methamphetamine. Through Sgt. Alyson Orr-Dodd's investigation she learned two other subject were with Teague but had fled on foot though the woods to the south. Sgt. Alyson Orr-Dodd placed Teague under arrest for several charges, and learned Marshall Hogan and Stevi Morgan who fled on foot were also wanted fugitives. Several Deputies, Oklahoma State Troopers, Sheriff Gary Dodd and Undersheriff Christan Smith arrived on scene and began canvassing the area and other ranches in the area.

A huge thank you to the Cain Ranch, Greeman Ranch, and Poe Ranch for assisting the Deputies and providing them with several side-by-sides to work the area. Also brought in were Deputies mounted on horse back. Sheriff Dodd also deputized two other local ranchers as Johnston County Sheriff's Posseman, which were mounted and helped canvas the area on horses with Deputies.

The Choctaw Nation Tribal Police arrived and assisted, as well as the Choctaw Nation Emergency Management, which flew several missions in the area with their drone. The Chickasaw Nation Emergency Management arrived with drone support as well. Also arriving in the area and assisting were Deputies from the Atoka County Sheriff's Office.

The lawman mounted on horse picked up tracks south of where they were last seen and began tracking south southeast. Several hours later tracking through dense brush and wooded areas, tracks were located from the two outlaws where they crossed Palmer Rd. tracking east. Law enforcement and air support expanded the perimeter east to South Dead End Rd. and Rock Hill Rd. With Deputies and Posseman closing in on horses and side-by-sides these two rascals popped out of the woods along State Highway 7 and South Dead End Rd.

We began receiving several phone calls from citizens seeing them along the highway. Deputies, Troopers and Officers arrived to the location with minutes locating the duo. Hogan jumped a barbed wire fence but was quickly confronted by Deputies. Hogan attempted to resist arrest, but after being dragged through a barbed wire fence while resisting, this appeared to take the last bit of starch out of this wretch.

Both Hogan and Morgan were taken into custody and transported to the Johnston County Jail on several local charges and their felony warrants. When caught, Hogan told the Sheriff “I thought y’all would just let us go and not look for us like this” Hahaha!!! You came to the wrong place!!!! 😊

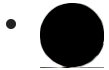
