NC4RJ Demands OSBI investigate alleged sexual assault

DEMAND CHIEF FOSTER INITIATE INDEPENDENT OSBI INVESTIGATION OF ASSAULT

An NPD officer distributed the home address of a Norman City Council member on social media. They can NOT be trusted to investigate the alleged incident of sexual assault that occurred last night at that address and neighboring address.

BACKGROUND INFO

There have been ongoing threats against female city council members and Mayor Clark, including an incident where a Lexington police officer wrote "Mayor (expletive), needs to be pulled out of office and tried on the court house lawn...the problem with politicians, they don't get hung in public anymore....#bringbackpublichangings!" - But the investigation into the incident by Norman PD found "no direct threat to public safety" (see below linked news article for reference).

We need outside investigators from OSBI to look into this incident. NPD cannot be trusted to handle this investigation when it was the action of an NPD officer that endangered the council member in the first place. It was an NPD officer who spread Council member Alex Scott's unredacted police report on social media with details of her assault and her home address. We cannot be confident NPD will do the right thing.

All of the women on council and the mayor are also being threatened and harassed, particularly from the "Reopen Norman" facebook group. NPD officers were allowed to intimidate and harass residents during the June 16th city council meeting, refusing to wear masks or to maintain social distance in the chambers despite repeated requests from city leaders and residents to do so. Off-duty officers brought firearms into the chambers against regulation and were not wearing body cams, in violation of their own policies. This culture of intimidation, violent threats, and complete disregard for public safety must end immediately.

Coronavirus in Oklahoma: Officer admits posting Facebook threat against Norman mayor

NORMAN — A Lexington police officer accused of threatening Norman Mayor Breea Clark on Facebook admitted to "writing and posting" the comment, Norman police reported Friday afternoon.

"The individual responsible for the comment admitted to writing and posting it on social media," police spokeswoman Sarah Jensen said in a news release. "Police investigators found no indication of a direct threat to public safety."

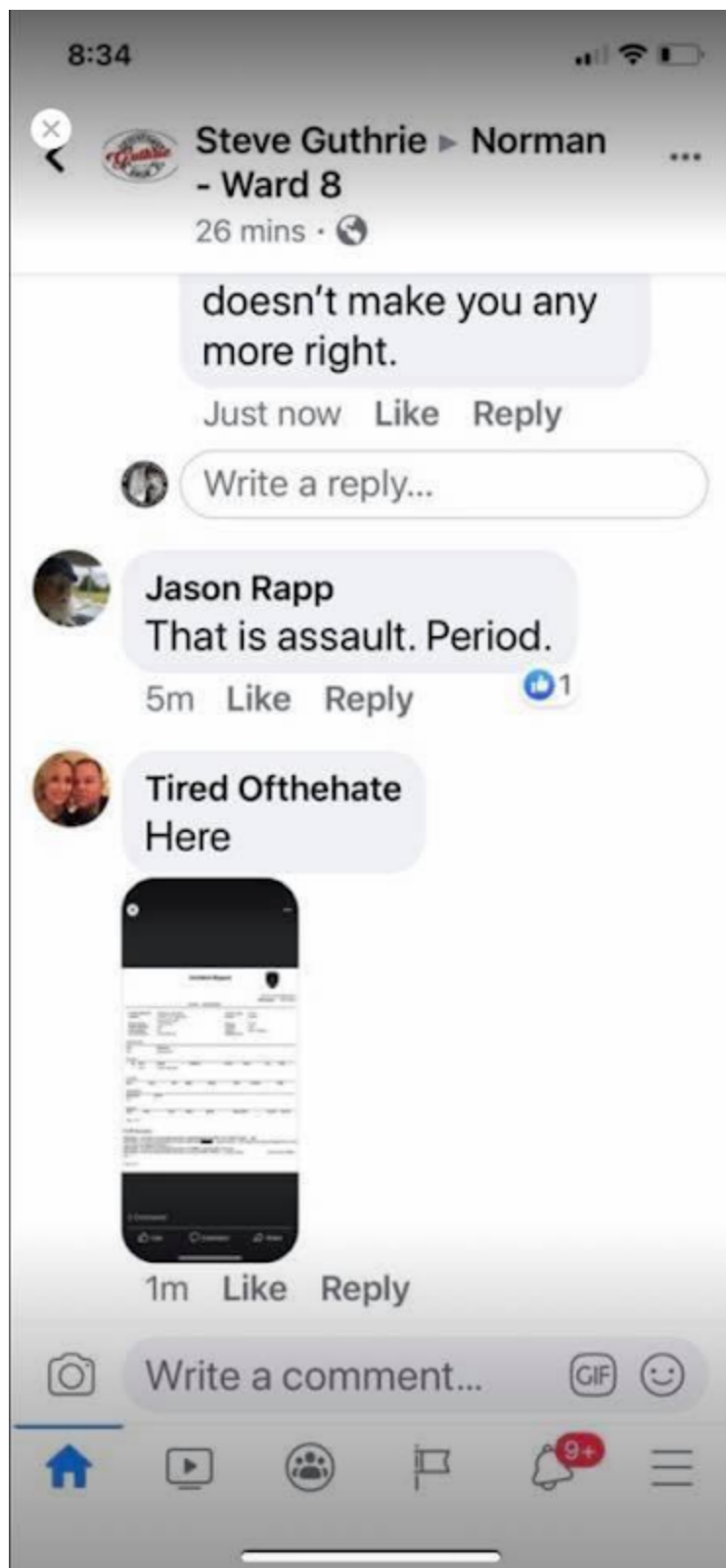

Police began investigating after Clark reported the Facebook post, which read: "Mayor (expletive), needs to be pulled out of office and tried on the court house lawn...the problem with politicians, they don't get hung in public



anymore....#bringbackpublichangings!"The comment investigated by police was attributed to Eddie Zaicek, a police officer in nearby Lexington who acknowledged being part of the "Re-Open Norman" group but initially denied posting the comment, saying his account had been hacked.

Norman investigators presented their findings to Cleveland County District Attorney Greg Mashburn's office, which determined charges could not be filed following a thorough review of the investigation, the release stated.

"Based on Oklahoma State Statute, the communication was not a direct threat," the release stated. "Further, the social media posting was determined to be communication protected by the First Amendment."

Clark has come under fire for her order in Oklahoma's third-largest city that prevents large gatherings inside places of worship. She and city council members Kate Bierman and Sereta Wilson have been criticized on a "Re-Open Norman" Facebook page.

In a statement issued Thursday, Clark said none of her decisions "were made with the intent to hurt residents or businesses." She observed that "people are scared, depressed, and even angry right now," and that she appeared "to be an outlet for those volatile emotions. We'll get through this, and when we do, I hope those residents find some peace.

"With that said, I will not hesitate to report death threats, especially when they come from people who are supposed to be protecting residents, not encouraging them to hang people on courthouse lawns," her statement concluded.

Zaicek's work status was not immediately known. A person who answered the phone at the Lexington Police Department declined to answer questions about the officer and said to call back Monday morning to speak to the interim chief.

Reached Friday, Zaicek declined to comment when asked if he was still employed by the Lexington Police Department.

"I'm sorry, I can't divulge any information pertaining to the case, even though I have been completely exonerated," he said in a text.

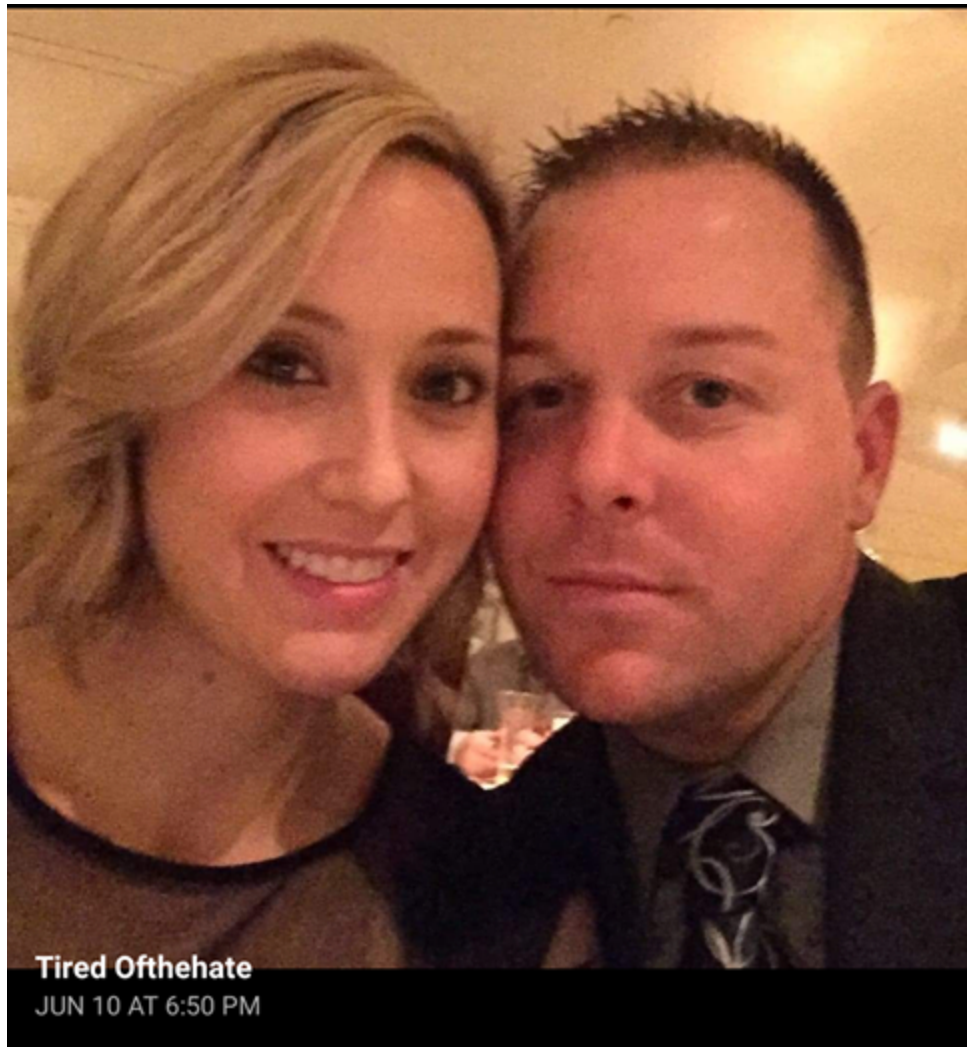

TW: Sexual Assault - Last Night

My neighbor gave me permission to share this experience. I was not home last night.

We live in a duplex, she was raped by stranger who broke into her side of our duplex last night. She had been out with her father, he dropped her off around Midnight and left. Then she was assaulted in her hallway.

Her rapist dug his elbow into her neck, pushed her into the wall, and told her "Maybe next time you'll learn your lesson." He threw her on the ground and raped her.

She was taken to NRHS by ambulance, then to the WRC. They took some of her belongings for testing, the police took fingerprint samples. My neighbor is a mother, her daughter was not here last night.

I only found out because our across the street neighbor texted me around 12:30am to see if I was okay since an ambulance and police were outside my place, so I checked on my neighbor this morning when I woke up. She is not okay.

People were passing around my address on social media (and wherever else) for 2 weeks & making light of my experiences with assault and stalking. I've received threatening messages and voicemails from men stating they, "hoped I didn't need the police" when something happened. They got the wrong woman. We are not okay.
