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## NARRATIVE No: 1 - Officer: ANDERSON, BRYLUN

On July 10, 2022, at approximately 1921, I Deputy Anderson was dispatched to the Red River Rose RV Park for a male subject that stated to dispatch that "he feels like doing some crazy stuff and if no one comes out to take care of him some bad things very bad things are going to happen." He also stated, "they should bring ammunition; that's a big thing; you need ammunition to take care of me." Then he advised dispatch, "he feels like murdering everybody and myself."

I arrived on the scene, and the camper trailer door was partially open, and I could see a male subject walking back and forth. He came to the door, and I started talking to him, trying to get his name and to figure out what was going on, and he was just being resistant with his answers. I spoke with him for over seven minutes, trying to get a good feel of the situation. He advised me that God would take him out tonight, and I advised him that God would not take him out tonight.

Dispatch had advised me earlier that he advised her that he had weapons, and I asked him what type of weapon he had, and he informed me that he would not tell me what weapon he had. After a short period, he advised me that he had a knife. He had already warned us that if we got any closer, it would be bad, and we would have to kill him. I advised dispatch that I was going to less lethal and to hold the net. I advised my partner, Deputy Huff, that I would choose a less-lethal option. The male subject advised me that he was not going to negotiate with us, and I told him that I was not a negotiator and was just talking to him. The male subject appeared to start getting irritated and cussing at me, stating that he would make me shoot him. I advised him that I was not going to shoot him, and he told me again that I would have to shoot him. With the male subject starting to get amped up, I decided to make a move before things got too far out of control.

I advised Deputy Huff to talk to him while I transitioned to less lethal; I advised the male subject that I had got a phone call from my dispatcher and went behind my unit to transition to less lethal. I asked Deputy Huff if he was ready to move forward, and he advised me yes. I came around from behind my unit, giving the male subject verbal commands to get on the ground, and he did not comply. The male subject was standing on top of the picnic table, and I continued to give him verbal commands, and he did not comply. I advised him to keep his hand up, and he kept putting them down to his pockets by the knife. I kept advising him to turn around to face away from us, and he would not comply. The male told me "no" that he would not comply with my commands, and I deployed one foam baton cartridge into his left beltline area. The male subject did not act like he was affected by the round, but he stepped down from the table and appeared to comply with my commands, and Deputy Huff placed him in wrist restraints for his safety and ours.

The male subject, later identified as Raymond Stone, was transported to the emergency room for a mental health evaluation. While at the hospital, Raymond explained to me that he was going to pull the knife out and come at me. He stated that he knew that if he pulled the knife out and came at me, I would have no choice but to shoot him; that was the whole point.
