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Officer Austin Hopp reporting:

On 6/26/20 at approximately 1627 hours, I responded to the area of 1325 N Denver Ave (Walmart) in reference to a shoplifting complaint. Dispatch advised a white female, red hair, wearing a grey sweater, jean pants, short stature and thin build had attempted to steal items from Walmart. Walmart employees had stopped the female and retrieved the items before she had fled on foot eastbound on E 13th St.

When I arrived in the area I located a female, later identified as KAREN GARNER (DOB [REDACTED]), matching that description walking eastbound in the 2600 block of Mountain Lion Dr. I activated my emergency lights and siren on my fully marked Loveland PD patrol car to stop GARNER. GARNER turned around and looked at me and continued walking eastbound. I got out of my patrol car, identified myself as POLICE and gave her several lawful orders to stop. To be noted, I was wearing a full Loveland PD patrol officer uniform with a clearly presented badge on the left chest area. GARNER said she was going home and continued walking away from me.

I grabbed onto GARNER's arm and gave her several loud, verbal commands to stop. GARNER began to violently pull away from me and tried to run away from me. Due to this active resistance and the fact that I was currently alone on scene with GARNER, I placed GARNER on the ground in a controlled manner to be able to safely and effectively detain her in handcuffs.

Once on the ground GARNER started trying to roll away from me and pulled the one arm I was holding onto away from me. GARNER tucked the other arm under her chest and refused to put it behind her back. After a short struggle of GARNER violently pulling away from me and resisting my efforts to safely detain her I was able to secure her in handcuffs. I stood GARNER up and attempted to escort her to my patrol car for an incident to arrest search of her person and to double lock the handcuffs. While doing this, GARNER continued to violently pull away from me and tried to drop to the ground. I had to place her against the hood of my patrol car to maintain physical control of her.

At this time Officer Jalali arrived on scene to assist. GARNER had slipped half of her left hand out of the handcuff. GARNER continued to pull and twist away from us as we re-secured her left hand and double locked the handcuffs. GARNER then began to crumple on the ground and not support her weight. Because of this GARNER was placed onto the ground while I conducted an incident to arrest search of her person.

GARNER was then escorted to Officer Jalali's patrol car while she continuously pushed against officers and actively resist our efforts to secure in the patrol car. GARNER continuously pushed against officers and attempted to climb out of the back seat of Officer Jalali's patrol car. During this GARNER wrapped one of her legs around my leg in an attempt to prevent her from being forcibly placed in the patrol car. Due to this, GARNER was again placed onto the ground and her legs were secured in a hobble restraint. With a struggle, GARNER was finally secured in Officer Jalali's patrol car and transported to LPD for booking.

Once at LPD, GARNER was escorted into booking. During this, GARNER said "I'm going to run" and continuously pushed and pulled against officers while being escorted into booking to the extent that she had to be physically carried by officers into booking. GARNER was placed into a booking cell where she refused to sit or cooperate with officers' attempts to remove the hobble restraint. GARNER tried repetitively to stand up and push against officers. GARNER was secured to the bench in the booking cell for the duration of the booking process. During this GARNER pulled against the restraints and attempted to escape them. GARNER was then transported to LCJ for booking.

To be noted, during the struggle to arrest GARNER as well as her repeated attempts to escape her restraints caused minor lacerations to her wrists as well a minor laceration to her chin. Photos were taken of her injuries and uploaded into evidence.

Officer Copello went to Walmart and spoke with employees who advised GARNER had taken \$13.88 worth of unpaid merchandise and left the store through the Garden Department door. The stolen items are as follows:

- T Shirt - \$3.48
- Chocolate candy - \$0.88
- Pepsi - \$4.28
- Shout Laundry Detergent - \$5.24

Total: \$13.88

Employees stopped GARNER outside the doors and she gave the stolen items back to employees and agreed to walk to the loss prevention office with them. While en route to the loss prevention office, GARNER turned and ran out of the store eastbound towards E 13th St.

On 062420 at approximately 1652 hours I was dispatched to booking at the Loveland Police Department to assist Officer Austin Hopp with the booking process and transport to the Larimer County Jail for his arrestee KAREN GARNER [REDACTED].

When I arrived in booking I assisted Officer Hopp and Officer Daria Jalali in getting GARNER into booking due to her uncooperative behavior. Once in booking we restrained her to the bench in a holding cell. GARNER continued to struggle while we completed paperwork.

When the paperwork was completed Officer Hopp and I placed GARNER in the rear passenger compartment and I transported her to the jail uncooperative. GARNER seemed confused and unaware of what was happening. At the jail, deputies removed GARNER from my vehicle and custody was turned over without incident.

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Officer Daria Jalali reporting:

On 062620, at approximately 4:27 pm, I was dispatch to a shoplifting call at Walmart at 1325 N. Denver Ave. Call notes stated a female tried taking items but loss prevention retrieved the items from the female. Before they got any further, the female took off going south on N. Denver Ave. and then E. on 13th St. toward Lowes.

While I was still on my way, Officer Austin Hopp aired that he was in contact with the female at the intersection of Mountain Lion Dr. and Sculptor Dr. A few minutes later, he said he had the female detained after a short struggle.

When I arrived on scene with Officer Hopp, I saw him struggling with the female on the front hood of his vehicle. Her hands were cuffed behind her back and she appeared to be resisting as she was trying to slip one of her wrists out of the cuff. We tried to get her re-cuffed but she continued to resist, pull her arms in and away from us, and tense up.

Officer Hopp and I took the female to the ground as she continued to resist us and tense up. On the ground, we attempted to double lock her handcuffs and search her but she continued to tense away from us and pull her body inward. She also had a tight grasp on a small blue rectangular container, which later appeared to be a wallet. Throughout the entire interaction, she kept forcibly trying to grab ahold of her wallet from us until I threw it on the ground away from the situation.

As we stood the female up to walk her to a car, she drug her feet, tensed up, and refused to walk. As we were struggling with getting her in the back of the vehicle, I noticed a white explorer vehicle pull up behind us as a driver got out and start yelling toward our direction. He said something along the lines of: "Is that much force necessary?" as he held his phone in our direction in a manner to record us.

We continued to try and get the female in the car but she continued to resist, refused put her legs in the car and tried to slide out of the door every chance she got. Throughout the entire incident, she kept repeating "I just want to go home" and kept trying to walk away from the situation. Officer Hopp went to talk to the male with the white explorer while I continued to try and get the females legs in the car, which she continued to fight me on. Officer Hopp came back and we hobbled the female on the ground with the help of Sgt. Phil Metzler. Once hobbled, we carefully placed her in the back of my patrol vehicle.

On scene, she repeated "I'm going home" multiple times every time she would resist us or try to walk away.

The female was identified by the name on her credit card as KAREN GARNER (■■■■). This was later verified by her driver's license photo.

From the time she was placed in my vehicle to the time we arrived at the police department, the female continuously tried to open the door with her cuffs and would not stop moving in the backseat. She also kept repeating phrases along the lines of- "I was going to pay for it" and "I was not going to steal".

When we got KAREN out of the vehicle at the police department, she looked at Officer Hopp and said: "I'm going to run away" and tried to walk off. She then drug her feet when we were walking toward the doors and had to be carried into a cell by myself, Officer Hopp, and CSO Tyler Blackett. Once we sat her down in the cell, she refused to sit and continued to try and walk off. She eventually had to be cuffed to the bench. Throughout the entire duration of us being back in the booking area, she continued to try and mess with the handcuffs.

At one point when I went into her cell to check in on her, she told me the cuffs were hurting her and asked me repeatedly to take them off. I asked her if she was going to try and continue to fight with us if we did and she refused to answer me.

This concludes my involvement with this case.
