#### NARRATIVE:

PRIMARY

CASE TITLE: Possession of a Controlled Substance - Methamphetamine

EVENT DESCRIPTION:

On 10/20/16 at approximately 1615 I was dispatched as the primary deputy to conduct a welfare check at 7650 Birch Bay Drive unit Spruce 4. Hailey KIRKEY called 911 to report Philip KIRKEY, her husband, was driving around making threats to kill himself. Hailey said Philip sent her a selfie photo with a gun pointed at his face. Deputy Bertand, Deputy Roosman, and Deputy Heinrich also responded.

Jerry WHITTED, Hailey's father, called 911 at 1554 to report Philip was driving his silver Chrysler Town and Country minimal erratically eastbound on Slater Road. See case 16I03914 for details. I ran a driver's check and saw Philip was listed as a convicted felon with a suspended driver's license (DWLS 3rd).

Deputy Roosma and I arrived on scene. Deputy Roosma kept watch over the area while I contacted Hailey and Jennifer REECE, Hailey's mother, in the parking lot. Hailey told me Philip has been up for days under the influence of methamphetamine. She said he has been threatening to kill himself for the past two days because she told him he needed to get clean or she would leave him. Philip did not accept these terms and began making the threats afterward. Hailey said Philip does not work and she believe he steals to support his drug habit.

Hailey said Philip was at the apartment one hour earlier and she saw him holding a black or gray pistol in a non-threatening manner on 10/19. She did not know if it was an actual firearm. Philip sent her the photograph of the pistol pointed at his face via Facebook at 1541. She showed me the photograph and later texted it to me so I could attach it to the case file. I could only see part of the pistol, which appeared to be some sort of semi-automatic appearing pistol. I was unable to determine if it was a firearm, a pellet pistol, or a toy.

Hailey confirmed she was not threatened or assaulted. Hailey and Philip have been together for about nine years and have three children (Ella KIRKEY, Damian KIRKEY, and Layla KIRKEY) in common. She said there was history of domestic violence from months ago and deputies were at the apartment in the early morning hours of 10/20. See case 16A23090 for details.

Hailey had no reason to believe Philip was a danger to anyone but himself. She said he made no mention of fighting law enforcement but did say he would not stop for anyone. He did tell Hailey he would shoot Jerry if Jerry did not stop following him.

What-Comm aired a "watchfor" for Philip and his vehicle but nobody located him. I recommended for Hailey to leave with her children for the night. Jennifer said Hailey and the children could stay with her in Ferndale. I stood by while Hailey and Jennifer packed up to leave. Jerry arrived and told me he is not scared of Philip at all, even given the threat. Everyone left the area. I and the other deputies cleared.

At 1731 Phillip called 911 from a location in Skagit County saying he heard his name was on the scanner. I called to speak with him. He sounded lucid and was more than willing to answer all my questions. He said he was not going to harm himself or others and was not in possession of a firearm. Philip claimed the photograph was fabricated or old. I advised him he should not be driving on a suspended driver's license and he understood. I determined there was

insufficient cause to believe he was a danger to himself or others and concluded the telephone call. I asked What-Comm to update Skagit County and WSP dispatches.

I advised Hailey I made contact with Philip and would be taking no further action. She understood.

At 2221 Deputy Cadman stopped the the vehicle in the 7600 block of Birch Bay Drive. Deputy Cadman arrested Philip based on probable cause for DWLS 3rd Degree (see case number 16A23149). Deputy Slick and I responded to assist. The traffic stop was actually in the parking lot for 7650 Birch Bay Drive. I advised Deputy Cadman booking for Philip was appropriate because he had a prior DWLS arrest and I had just told him earlier in the night not to drive.

Deputy Streubel and K9 "Jag" responded. I contacted Philip as he sat in the back seat of Deputy Cadman's patrol vehicle. Deputy Cadman said he read Philip his constitutional rights and Philip was willing to speak with us.

Philip denied voluntary consent to search the vehicle. He maintained there was no contraband in the vehicle but did not want us to search. Deputy Streubel deployed K9 "Jag" around the exterior of the vehicle and told me K9 "Jag" alerted to the presence of illegal drugs multiple times.

Deputy Sreubel contacted Philip while I returned to my patrol vehicle. Philip then gave voluntary consent briefly for Deputy Streubel and me to search the vehicle. Deputy Cadman remained with Philip while Deputy Streubel and I approached the van. I began searching the driver's seat and Deputy Streubel searched the passenger seat.

Deputy Streubel located a red folding knife on the front passenger seat with what appeared to be methamphetamine residue on the blade before Philip told us to cease searching. I also saw many newer smartphones and Deputy Streubel said he saw a newer tablet. Philip admitted to Deputy Streubel the substance on the blade was likely methamphetamine.

Deputy Streubel requested an impound tow. Deputy Cadman transported Philip to the WCSO Jail for booking. I cleared. Deputy Slick followed ASAP Towing to the WCSO Evidence Building and locked the minivan into an alarmed evidence bay pursuant to a search warrant.

On the afternoon of 10/21/16 I contacted Whatcom County Deputy Prosecutor Cailtin McGrane via telephone. She conferenced me in with Whatcom County District Court Judge Matthew Elich. I applied for a search warrant to search the vehicle for illegal drugs, drug paraphernalia, documents of dominion and control, and other things (see the search warrant document for specifics). Judge Elich granted the search warrant and I affixed his signature to the search warrant document.

I went to the Evidence Building and Deputy Jilk arrived to assist me. WCSO Evidence Technician Tara Tienhaara arrived and opened the locked and alarmed bay at 1725. Deputy Jilk and I began executing the search warrant at 1738.

Deputy Jilk photographed the vehicle before we started the search. I seized the red folding knife from the front passenger seat. I used Nartec field test kits for methamphetamine and the instructions showed a positive result would be indicated by the color blue. A portion of the substance on the blade tested positive with a field test kit for the presumptive presence of methamphetamine. I located a wallet containing Philip's Washington ID card behind the front passenger seat. Deputy Jilk located a Bellingham Pawnshop pawnslip bearing Philip's name.

Deputy Streubel arrived to assist when Deputy Jilk cleared to handle other calls. Deputy Streubel located a small baggy with what appeared to be methamphetamine residue in a box near the back gate of the vehicle. A portion of the substance in the baggy tested positive with a field test kit for the presumptive presence of methamphetamine. I used the digital scale at the evidence building to weight the knife and the baggy. The knife with the residue weighed 207.2 gross grams and the baggy with the residue weighed 0.6 gross grams.

During the search warrant service, we did not locate any firearms. We checked all the smartphones and a computer tablet to see if any of the items were listed as stolen but they were not. I found multiple receipts for the phones and determined the phones were likely not stolen so I did not seize them.

I completed the seizure list and the certificate of search. I placed a copy of the search warrant, seizure list, and certificate of search on the center console and took photographs of the vehicle at the conclusion of the warrant service at 2027. I drove the vehicle into the evidence building parking lot and locked it up. I returned the key to the evidence building key box.

I determined probable cause existed to believe Philip committed the crime of Possession of a Controlled Substance - Methamphetamine. I went to the station and placed the seized items (the knife, the ID card, the pawn slip, and the baggy) into evidence.

I placed the original search warrant documents in the detective sergeant's mailbox. I placed copies of the search warrant documents, Deputy Streubel's K9 affidavit, photo copies of the seized ID card and pawnslip, and the evidence log into the report box. I went to the jail and learned Philip already bailed out so I posted probable cause for his arrest.

On 10/22/16 Deputy Wagenaar informed me Philip called 911 earlier in the day inquiring about how to retrieve his vehicle and belongings. Deputy Wagenaar was not able to make in person contact.

At approximately 1840 Deputy Mellema and I went to 7650 Birch Bay Drive unit Spruce 4 in an attempt to contact Philip. The apartment was dark and I heard no movement inside. I called Philip's cell phone but it went straight to voicemail. I called Hailey's cell phone and it went to voicemail. Severeal more attempts to call both phones yielded the same results. Deputy Mellema and I cleared.

Deputy Streubel, Deputy Slick, and Deputy Cadman completed supplemental narratives. Philip needs to be located and arrested.

STATEMENTS TAKEN: None.

EVIDENCE: The photograph Hailey forwarded is attached. Photographs from the search warrant service are attached. I placed the seized items (the knife with suspected methamphetamine residue, the ID card, the pawn slip, and the baggy with suspected methamphetamine residue) into evidence.

#### EVENT DESCRIPTION:

On October 20, 2016, at approximately 2239 hours, I was on routine patrol in the Birch Bay area. I knew that Dep Wood was currently investigating an incident that involved Philip KIRKEY and that KIRKEY had been driving his silver colored van, Wa license AVB2272. I had checked the vans registration and found that the male registered owner, Philip KIRKEY, has a suspended drivers license. Approximately 30 minutes later I saw KIRKEY's van, AVB2272, driving W/B on Alderson Rd approaching Birch Bay Dr. I turned around behind the van and caught up to it on Birch Bay Dr. I activated my emergency lights and stopped the van to investigate the possible driving violation.

I contacted the driver and recognized him as Philip KIRKEY. I recognized KIRKEY from a booking photo. I asked KIRKEY for his drivers license and vehicle paperwork. KIRKEY told me he didn't have his driver's license with him. A Washington DOL Drivers check confirmed that KIRKEY's driving status was Suspended 3 Degree. KIRKEY's drivers license was suspended on November 15, 2014. Reason given for suspension was refusal of breath or blood. KIRKEY has 4 prior DWLS 3 arrests. I took KIRKEY into custody and put him in the rear of my patrol vehicle. I read KIRKEY his rights as per Miranda from my Dept issued rights card. KIRKEY said he understood and was willing to talk to me.

Dep Wood, Dep Slick, and Dep Streubel responded to my location. While I was issuing KIRKEY his citations, Dep Streubel deployed his K-9 partner Jag around KIRKEY's van. After deploying Jag, Dep Streubel asked KIRKEY for consent to search the van. KIRKEY agreed to the search. Dep Streubel and Dep Wood started searching the van. I remained with KIRKEY in my vehicle. Dep Streubel and Dep Wood had just started searching when KIRKEY asked me if they were going to search the rear area of the van. I told KIRKEY that Dep Streubel and Dep Wood were going to search the entire van. KIRKEY told me he didn't want them to search the rear of the van. Before I could relay this information to Dep Streubel and Dep Wood, KIRKEY told me he wanted them to stop searching his vehicle. Dep Slick was standing next to my vehicle. I told Dep Slick to tell Dep Streubel and Dep Wood to stop the search. Dep Streubel and Dep Wood stopped searching immediately.

I transported KIRKEY to the Whatcom County Jail and booked him into jail for Driving while License Suspended 3 Degree.

EVENT DESCRIPTION:

On 7/16/23 at 0338 hours, I observed a vehicle parked behind a closed business in the area of Laurel Rd and Guide Meridian Rd. I contacted the vehicle with Deputy Craig and observed a male, Philip KIRKEY, slumped over the wheel with the keys in the ignition. In addition a bag of suspected fentanyl powder was visible on the center console next to Philip with a burnt foil under Philip's arm. Along with the suspected narcotics, I could see what appeared to be a brown, flintlock style firearm in plain view on the back seat of the vehicle.

I requested additional units due to the possibility of firearms in the vehicle. I woke Philip up and gave him commands to exit the vehicle. Philip was placed into custody and read his constitutional rights. Philip granted consent to Deputies for a search of the vehicle after his consent warnings were given and he stated he understood. The following was located during the consent search;

- -Flintlock pistol with no markings, with all firing mechanisms intact and appeared in working order
- (69 )22 long rifle bullets, (2) 12GA shotgun shells, and (2) 30-30 Cartridges -One pair of metal knuckles
- -1.6G of suspected fentanyl powder
- -Misc drug paraphernalia (tooter, foil, pipe, container with residue)

While speaking with Philip after the consent search, he confirmed post Miranda that the suspected narcotics were in fact fentanyl powder. As well as he knowingly possessed the firearm and ammunition as for he received it from his brother. The metal knuckles were located during the search below where Philip's right leg was when he exited the vehicle.

There is probable cause to believe Philip committed the crime of Unlawful Possession of a firearm in the second degree times two. Philip is a convicted felon, as well as he has domestic violence convictions. Philip knowingly possessed an unmarked flintlock pistol with all firing mechanisms intact and appearing to be in working order. As well as in accordance with federal law Philip is ineligible to possess ammunitions and he possessed 73 total rounds. There is also probable cause to believe Philip committed the crime of Possessing dangerous weapons. When Philip exited the vehicle, he had metal knuckles located below his right leg. Philip was placed in the back of my patrol car after the consent search. The evidence was placed into evidence bags. Both Philip and the seized evidence were transported to WCSO Jail and booked without incident.

Philip's vehicle was legally parked in a private parking lot. Philip requested that the vehicle be left. I informed Philip that the establishment could potentially tow his vehicle and that if it was left there was no certainties on whether it would still be there pending his release. I allowed Philip to call his wife, leaving her a voicemail for where the vehicle was located, encouraging her to pick the truck up at her earliest convenience.

This concluded my investigation.

1.) On 09-04-10 at about 0032 hours, I responded to suspicious vehicle (10A19061) in the 7100 block of Tall Cedars Lane. An off duty Customs and Border Protection Officer observed a vehicle parked near a public utilities water pump station. This area is private property and should have no one present at these hours. The officer called in and reported a vehicle pulled up and he watched as three subjects in the car prepared narcotics in a soda can and drew the drugs into a syringe. One of the occupants put a rubber band around his arm. All these actives are consistent with narcotics ingestion. I arrived on scene and saw the vehicle parked without its headlights on. As I pulled up I could see three subjects inside of the vehicle. As soon as they acknowledged my presence they began to move around in the car furtively. (We later learned the two subjects in the car had just bought the heroin about 2 blocks from their location. The officer stated no vehicle have come or left on Tall Cedars Ln since the suspicious vehicle pulled in and my arrival)

I exited and contacted the occupants. After interviewing them two of the subjects were arrested for possessing heroin. I retrieved a "rig" freshly loaded with heroin. They were identified as (W-1) William Rickstein and (W-2) Felicia. Both William and Felicia gave written statement they buy from two subjects down the road. They identified the heroin sellers as Phil and Nate. William said he called Phil and asked if he had anything going on? William said this is a question asking if he has any heroin to sell. Phil replied to William, Yeah, come on over. William and Felicia said they have bought from Phil numerous times in the past. They both stated they went over at about 2330 hours and walked into the house. Phil got up from the living room and cut a piece of heroin off a larger piece on the kitchen table, put it on an electronic scale, and wrapped it in a plastic grocery bag and handed it to William. William said he threw \$25.00 on the table and they both left. William and Felicia said they drove to the end of the road where they immediately began to shoot up. William and Felicia said no one has left or come to Phil's since they have been parked there.

As I was finishing processing William and Felicia Deputy Freeman and Deputy VanLoo arrived. They were briefed on the call and I advised them I was going to seek a search warrant for Phil's residence. They stood by at the house securing it from the outside. I field tested the substance in the syringe. It field tested positive for heroin. I also had William and Felicia confirm which residence they had bought the heroin from. It was the Kirkey residence, 7044 Tall Cedars Lane.

Deputy Freeman briefed Acting Supervisor Cadman who sent Deputies Linderman, Murphy, Taddonio, and Deputy Bogle to assist.

I contacted Deputy Prosecutor Hulbert. He contacted Whatcom County Superior Court Judge Uhrig who granted a search warrant for the residence.

An entry team consisting of Deputy Van Loo (beanbag), Deputy Taddoin, Deputy Freeman, myself, and Deputy Linderman was formed. Deputy Murphy was assigned to a rear containment position, and Deputy Cadman called

the residence from his vehicle. Deputy Cadman called the number listed but no one would answer. We could hear the phone ringing inside. (It should also be noted there were multiple surveillance cameras mounted the house)

I knocked and announced our presence identifying us, and announcing our intention to execute a search warrant. Commands were giving for the occupants to exit the house with their hands in the air. Movement could be heard in the house and seen obscured through curtains. Deputy Murphy advised there was movement in the back bedroom but still no one would answer the door. I knock and announced "sheriff's office search warrant, come to the door" two more time. Each time I pounded loudly on the metal siding of the trailer.

As the announcements were being giving I could hear dogs barking inside. Deputy Taddonio had warned us they have large pit bull dogs. I heard Deputy Taddonio yell to the occupants to secure the dogs and to not let them out.

As the door opened a subject emerged slowly. He was later identified as (A-2) Larry Kirkey. Larry came out onto a small enclosed porch. He initially did not immediately put his hands up but eventually did and walked down the stairs to awaiting deputies. Deputy Linderman took control of Larry. As this was going on another subject came out holding a large pit-bull. The dog was aggressively barking and trying to pull away. This subject matched the description of Phil and was later identified as (A-1) Philip Kirkey. Philip was nearly wrestling with the dog trying to keep him from breaking free. The dog seemed very aggressive and appeared like he wanted to charge us.

While Philip was trying to keep his dog from attacking us, another large pit-bull came out onto the porch aggressively barking. The dog was looking around, leaning forward, and barking with a wide open mouth. A third subject emerged and tried to take a hold of the dog. The dog was jumping back and forth trying to break free from his hold. This subject, later identified as (S-1) Clayton Kirkey, looked frightened. Deputies were yelling at Clayton to hold the dog and to not let it go. He was told if the dog was to get loose he would be shot. (Our initial entry plan was to beanbag any dog that comes at us aggressively) Clayton seemed to loose his grip and the dog ran toward Deputy VanLoo. The dog was barking and still leaning forward with his head up in the air. Saliva was spattering from his mouth and he appeared to be attacking.

As soon as the dog broke free I continued to yell at Clayton to get the dog. Deputy VanLoo backed up tracking the dog. As the dog closed the distance Deputy VanLoo shot one round of a beanbag at the dog. This had no effect and the dog bit the shotgun barrel. I then watched as the dog went under the shotgun toward Deputy VanLoo's legs. Deputy VanLoo had also backed into Deputy Taddonio who was behind him. Fearing Deputy VanLoo was going to be seriously hurt and I had a clear back stop, I sidestepped and shot the dog. The dog turned toward me so I continued firing until I saw an effect on the dog's advancement. The dog stopped and turned away, backing up near a boat and laid down. Seeing the threat was stopped I turned my attention toward Clayton, Philip, and the unclear house.

Clayton yelled and expressed concern about his dog. I could hear the dog labored breathing and it expire from its wounds. Clayton was detained and Philip was directed to put his dog in a parked car in the driveway securing it and preventing it from injuring us. Philip also reported he had a shotgun in his bedroom.

Because we had multiple subjects not secure in patrol cars, weapons involved, the residence had not been secured, I requested assistance from Ferndale Police. Three units responding and assisted on outside containment. Deputies Van Loo, Taddonio, Freeman, Linderman, and I executed the warrant clearing the house locating no one else inside.

I spoke with each deputy involved with the initial entry. It was concluded that Clayton appeared to have not intentionally let his dog go to attack us. I believe the dog escaped his control and attempted to attack on his own.

Larry, Clayton, and Philip were secured in patrol cars. Deputies Taddonio, Freeman, Murphy, Bogel, and Linderman executed the search warrant. I interviewed Philip and Clayton.

I first spoke with Philip. He was advised of his constitutional rights which he waived. Philip said he is addicted to heroin and sells regularly from the family house. A series of questions and answers were gone through: Who sells dope?

I do.

What kind of dope?

Heroin

How long have you been selling?

A year or maybe just less than a year.

What kind of quantities?

An ounce.

Who do you sell to?

Friends.

How many times a day to you make sales?

Maybe 10.

How often?

Every day.

How many times a day?

4 to 10... I guess.

How much do you sell...what kind of volume?

From \$10.00 to \$100.00.

Who did you sell to tonight?

Don't know.

Dillon early this morning.

What about tonight?

Philip completed a written statement admitting he sells heroin regularly for profit. Philip did get emotional while we spoke and said he needs help getting off the drug. Philip was very pleasant and cooperative when we spoke.

I then spoke with Clayton after he was advised of his constitutional rights. Clayton said he only smokes weed. He said he does not use heroin. He admitted to having "about 2 Grams" in his room. I asked Clayton, Why are we here?

He said he knows the other stuff is going on here but only moved in 4 months ago. He said he can't really explain it. I asked if he is selling narcotics. He said, No. I asked Clayton who is selling narcotics? He said he didn't know. I asked, "You don't know or don't want to say?" He said, "Both...I stay to myself." I asked if his father sells and he said he didn't think so.

I asked Clayton about the dog. He explained his dog just barks. He said the dog is afraid of the dark and would never bite anyone. I asked why he let the dog go? He said he got out of my hands. Clayton believes he was inside of the house when the shots were fired. I explained from our perspective what happened with the dog. Clayton said he understands why we had to protect ourselves. Clayton was very upset about his dog and broke down several times crying. I reiterated what our intents were and he again said he understood and that he was "not mad at us."

Deputies located numerous items relating to narcotics distribution and usage in the residence. Each room was clearly inhabited by each member of the family. See an attached sketch by Deputy Freeman.

The following items were retrieved from Philip bedroom: A Benelli shotgun, one glass bong, a scale with heroin residue, 3 marijuana pipes with residue, a vehicle mounted charger and GPS system (suspect stolen), GPS with mount (suspected stolen), Satellite radio system (suspected stolen), a digital scale, 146.6 Grams of marijuana, 406 Grams of marijuana, document of dominion and control, narcotics crib notes (see attached), marijuana grow light, two ballast's, a Sentry safe (this safe was described by Philip as containing the remaining unsold heroin), a Brinks fire safe containing coins.

#### NARRATIVE:

Based on the statements of William, Felicia, and Philip, a total of 146.6 Grams of marijuana, packaging, and weighing equipment, probable cause for Possessing/Delivering Heroin and Possession of Marijuana over 40 Grams was established for Philip. During the execution of the warrant in Philips room we asked for consent to retrieve the heroin in the safe. He waived his rights and consented to the search after signing a Ferrier waiver. The deputies were still unable to open the safe. Having no success we asked Philip if he would open the safe but due to the late hour he asked to be transported to the jail.

The following items were located in Larry's room: documents of dominion and control, a total of 889.7 Grams of marijuana, 10.8 Grams of suspected heroin on Larry's nightstand, numerous syringes in drawers, and numerous items of drug paraphernalia.

Based on the facts Larry was in possession of 889.7 Grams of marijuana and 10.8 Grams of heroin, probable cause for Possessing Heroin and Possession of Marijuana over 40 Grams was established.

The following items were located in Clayton's room: Crib notes, a pawn slip for Clayton, a box of miscellaneous marijuana and heroin drug paraphernalia, three boxes of drug pipes, drug pipe making materials, approximately 7.5 Grams of marijuana, a razor blade with heroin residue, 2 digital scales with heroin residue, 5 pipes and two bongs, and a shotgun shell.

All of Claytons items were booked for destruction.

All the above items were taken to the sheriff's office and booked by Deputies Freeman and Linderman. Deputy Freeman also took numerous photos of the scene and submitted them to sheriff's office evidence.

Search warrant paperwork was completed with a copy left at the residue. I asked several times if I could help Clayton with his deceased dog. He declined.

Philip and Larry were transported and booked into the county jail. Clayton was released from his detention.

I contacted Larry at the jail and re-advised him of his constitutional rights which he waived. I asked if he knew Philip was selling. Larry said he "knew he is but does not support it." Larry said he has a problem but he is too strong to ask for help.

I asked about the marijuana found in his room. He said he got it for free and he has to smoke a lot to have any effect. Larry said he is not selling it and has not yet had a chance to get his medical marijuana card. Larry did sw he grew marijuana outside last year. He said he was planning on starting a grow in one of the bedrooms until Clayton moved in. I also asked about the heroin in his room. Larry suggested the heroin must be his ex-wife's even though she had not lived there for a year. I explained to Larry the heroin looked fresh and it was located on

#### **NARRATIVE:**

1. On 9/4/10 at approximately 0215 hours, I responded to Tall Cedars Road to assist Deputy Nyhus in an ongoing investigation. I had been advised Deputy Nyhus was conducting a drug investigation where he was going to be executing a search warrant at (A2) Larry Kirkey's residence.

In contacting Deputy Nyhus and forming a plan, I advised him I had previously been to the home and knew of them to have at least one pit-bull. In the previous contact, the dog had to be restrained in the house and Larry exited to speak to me.

With the possibility of there being a hostile dog it was determined Deputy Van Loo would approach with less lethal and I would cover him. After formulating an approach plan, we approached the house and Deputy Nyhus banged on the side of the house and loudly announce our presence. Deputy Nyhus announced who we were and advised we had a search warrant. After banging several times we observed movement in the home. I observed Larry come to the front door and open it. I could also hear a dog moving and beginning to bark. Larry opened the door and we announced who we were again. Larry was instructed that everyone needed to exit the home and they needed to control their dog. With the dog sounding agitated Larry shut the door and I observed (A) Phillip Kirkey behind him holding onto a large pit-bull. Larry opened the door again and Phillip slowly came out restraining the pit-bull as it growled and barked at us. I advised Phillip he needed to keep ahold of his dog as if it were to be released it would be shot. Phillip continued to maintain control of the dog. Phillip continued off the porch and Larry exited the home onto the front porch.

With Larry on the front porch, I observed another male moving inside the house and then coming to the front door also holding onto a pit-bull. The male stepped onto the porch and upon getting onto the porch, I observed the second pit-bull run away from the male and the male stand up. The dog immediately ran off the porch and approached Deputy Van Loo. Deputy Van Loo lowered the barrel of his shotgun to keep the dog back and away from him. The dog was barking, growling and snapping towards Deputy Van Loo. I observed the dog apparently trying to bite Deputy Van Loo's weapon causing Deputy Van Loo to step backwards attempting to back away from the dog. I then observed several shots as Deputy Nyhus stepped to the side and discharged his firearm. I saw the dog retreat and I returned focus to Larry and Phillip who maintained their position. I then observed (S \ \) Clayton Phillips charge down the stairs screaming about his dog. Clayton was ordered to the ground and was eventually detained by Deputy Freeman.

Upon detaining Clayton, Larry was also detained and Phillip escorted the other pit-bull to a nearby car where it was secured and Phillip was detained. After all people were secured, I briefly checked the dog and found it was obviously deceased. With all people detained we cleared the house and verified there were no other people in the residence.

#### **NARRATIVE:**

1 On 9-4-10 at approximately 0124 hours I responded to assist Deputy Nyhus with a suspicious vehicle investigation in the 7100 block of Tall Cedars Lane. Upon arrival Deputy Nyhus requested that I respond to the Kirkey residence of 7044 Tall Cedars Lane, as he had probable cause to believe some of the Kirkey family was selling Heroin from the residence.

I observed the Kirkey residence, and I filled out the warrant affidavit. Several deputies responded to assist with the execution of the warrant. I responded to the rear of the residence with Deputy Murphy, as he said he heard lots of movement back there. While at the rear of the residence I heard Deputy Nyhus state several times commands to the effect of, "Police, Search Warrant, Come to the door." Shortly thereafter I heard several Deputies command, "Do not let the dogs go," and seconds later I heard gunshots from the front side of the residence.

I left Deputy Murphy at the rear to assist on the front side of the residence. I saw two white males standing outside the front door. One was holding onto a dog, and the other, later identified as Clayton Kirkey, stood next to him. I gave him several commands to lay down on the ground with his hands out to the side. When Clayton finally complied I grabbed onto his right wrist, and I pulled him away from the doorway. Once safely out of the way of the door I cuffed his hands behind his back, and I checked them for proper fit. I did not double lock the cuffs at that point, as I was more concerned about the unknown threats from inside of the home. Deputy Linderman came up to take Clayton from the area, and as he stood Clayton up I told Deputy Linderman of the need to double lock the cuffs.

Once everyone that came out was secured we searched the residence for anyone else inside. After that was complete we executed the search warrant for drugs, proceeds, paraphernalia, and documents of dominion and control. I photographed the exterior and interior of the scene. Deputies Linderman, Bogle, Murphy, Taddonio, and I conducted the search warrant. I made a rough sketch of the scene, and I logged all of the evidence that was seized on the search warrant. For additional details see the search warrant paperwork for this case. I left the appropriate warrant copies at the residence. Deputy Linderman transported the evidence to the station, and I booked the items along with the photos into evidence.

#### NARRATIVE:

1) On 9-4-10, at about 0230 hours, I assisted Deputy Nyhus with a Vucsa call at 7044 Tall Cedars Ln. Upon arrival I was advised Deputy Nyhus had obtained a warrant for the residence. After a short briefing reference entry it was decided Deputy Cadman would make a phone call into the residence to see if we could gain compliance for them to come out. Deputy Murphy went around to the back of the residence, while Deputies Nyhus, VanLoo, Taddonio, and Freeman went to the front of the house. We heard movement inside of the house and then we heard Deputy Cadmans phone call, however no one would answer the phone.

At this time Deputy Cadman assisted us at the front door while Deputy Nyhus knocked on the glass window and announced Sheriff's Office, search warrant and to come to the door. We could hear scrambling throughout the house and we knocked and announced several more times and ordered them to come to the front door. Deputies had heard running in the back of the house and Deputy Freeman ran to the back of the house to assist Deputy Murphy. The door was then opened by A- 2 Larry Kirkey. Kirkey was ordered to come out of the residence. As Larry started walking down the stairs A- 1 Phillip Kirkey exited the front door holding onto what appeared to be a Pit-Bull. Phillip or one of the Kirkey's told us the dog would bite us if he let it go.

Several of the Deputies ordered Phillip not to let go of the dog, or the dog would be shot. The dog was extremely agitated and Phillip struggled to restrain the dog. We started to order Phillip to walk his dog down the stairs and we would have him secure the dog into one of the vehicles in the driveway. As Phillip started to walk his dog down the stairs, S-1 Clayton Kirkey came to the front of the door with a brown and white colored Pit-Bull type dog. Deputies ordered Clayton numerous times not to let go of his dog or the dog would be shot.

At this time I was on the side of the house, directly in path of the walkway to the front door as the deputies were on my left. I could not see the entire events of what took place as my responsibilities were to cover the front door. At one point I saw the dog come loose from Clayton and the dog charged Deputy VanLoo. I moved to cover the threat of the dog and saw the dog lunge towards the shot-gun of Deputy VanLoo's. To me the dog was a threat and appeared to going to attack Deputy VanLoo. As I was about to stop the threat I heard several shots and saw the dog go down. As this was occurring I directed my responsibilities back to covering the front door in case another person came out.

At this time Larry started backing up towards me and I decided to detain him into handcuffs as Clayton was screaming and very upset that we had just shot his dog. I walked Larry back and placed him into a patrol vehicle. I then came back and ordered Phillip to place his dog in one of the un-locked vehicles on the property. I then handed Phillip off to a Ferndale PD unit who had just arrived. After we detained all three, we completed a search of the house to make sure the house was secure and safe.

#### **NARRATIVE:**

I then assisted in a search of the residence and searched with Deputy Bogle. We first searched Phillips Bedroom, the room furthest west in the residence. I located a black colored 12-gauge shot-gun between the mattress and the box-spring. We also located several baggies of marijuana to include a glass jar with marijuana in it. We also located numerous glass smoking devices throughout the room. In the closet was a marijuana grow light and in the corner of the bedroom was a safe. Inside of the bathroom were numerous spoons with what appeared to be heroin residue and numerous used needles. This was obviously Phillips bedroom as there were paper documents which had his name on them.

Deputy Bogle and I then searched the living room area and located numerous glass pipes of the coffee table and on the shelves. I then stood by while other deputies completed their search of their assigned areas.

We then loaded all seized items up into my patrol vehicle and I transported them to the station where I assisted Deputy Freeman impounding all items into evidence. No further action taken by me.

On 09-04-10 at about 0032 hours, deputies responded to a drugs complaint in the 7100 block of Tall Cedars Lane. Two subjects arrested for possessing heroin gave detailed statements of purchasing the heroin at 7044 Tall Cedars Ln moments before our contact. They said they purchased the heroin from Phil, a 17 year old white male residing at the home. A search warrant was obtained for the residence.

Deputies executed the search warrant and located Philip Kirkey inside. Philip admitted to selling heroin out of the home. He stated he buys heroin by the ounce in Mt. Vernon once or twice a week and sells everyday to friends and other acquaintances. Philip said he sells to 4-10 people a day, quantities ranging from \$10-\$100.00, seven days a week. Philip also said he is a heroin user and is addicted. Philip said he sold to 3-4 people today. He thought he sold \$20.00 worth of heroin to a male named Andrew and an unknown female at about 2400 hours tonight but could not remember specifically. Philip said he keeps his heroin in a medium sized safe in his bedroom. He said there is about "\$100.00 worth" left in the safe. Deputies also located 146+ of Marijuana in Philip's bedroom.

Philips father, Larry Kirkey also admitted he is aware Philip sells heroin out of his house.

Because two subjects described Philip as selling them \$25.00 worth of heroin, Philip admitting to selling heroin regularly out of his home, and him admitting to having additional heroin in a safe (the safe is going to require a lock smith to retrieve the remaining narcotics), an electronic narcotics scale was found, and extensive narcotics "crib notes" probable cause for Possession of Heroin with Intent to Deliver was established for Philip.



#### NARRATIVE:

1 On 9-4-10 I was working as S91 and was tasked with assisting the graveyard shift with a suspicious vehicle / drugs complaint in the 7000 blk of Tall Cedars. Neighbors called in reporting several individuals buying illegal narcotics from a nearby residence and using them just down the street. Deputy Nyhus was able to obtain a search warrant for the residence at 7044 Tall Cedars.

Prior to approaching the residence Deputy Taddonio advised there was a large pit-bull dog that had barked and acted aggressively towards deputies in the past. I deployed my patrol shotgun, loaded with less than lethal bean bag rounds. Deputies, Freeman, Nyhus, Taddonio, Linderman, Acting Sgt Cadman, and I approached the residence to execute and serve the search warrant.

There was a medium height wooden fence around the yard of the trailer with "beware of dog signs". We stopped in the yard just past the front gate. There was no indication a dog was anywhere in the fence yard. An attempted phone call was placed inside the residence with no response. From my vantage point I could see into the trailer, specifically the kitchen / entry area.

Deputy Nyhus knocked on the side of the trailer and announced in a loud voice "Sheriff's Office, Search Warrant Come To the Door." I could hear people running around inside and witnessed a shirtless male run from a front room of the trailer into and past the kitchen. Several more commands were given for the occupants of the trailer to come to the door with accompanying knocks. Someone inside asked "Who is it." "Sheriff's Office Search Warrant, Come To The Door" was the reply. Another male voice from inside advised "I have dog, he will bite." I could hear a large dog barking aggressively inside the trailer. I gave verbal commands to hold the dog and not let him go. I also advised the occupants of the trailer if the dog got loose and attacked deputies it would be shot.

An older subject later identified as (A2) Larry Kirkey opened the front door and stepped out with his hands visible as instructed. A second subject identified as (A1) Phillip Kirkey exited the front door onto the porch area holding onto large reddish brown pit-bull. The pit-bull was attempting to break free of Phillips grasp. It was trying to break free towards the deputies not away. As Larry and Phillip were coming off the front porch, being detained and securing the pit-bull, a third subject identified as (S1) Clayton Kirkey exited the residence hanging on to another pit-bull with both hands on what appeared to be the collar. I could see Clayton had two hands on the dog trying to restrain it from running towards the myself and the other deputies. The pit-bull was white and brown and was between Clayton's legs straining to get away. The pit-bull was barking aggressively towards the deputies and rearing up on its hind legs.

NARRATIVE:

I was dividing my attention between both dogs who were acting aggressively and trying to break free towards the deputies. As I turned back to the white and brown pit-bull Clayton was attempting to hold I saw it bounding down the steps towards Deputy Taddonio and myself. Deputy Taddonio illuminated the pit-bull and it stopped momentarily. It began to lunge towards my lower legs and I thrust the muzzle of my shotgun towards its head to prevent it from biting me as I took my weapon off "safe." I fired one beanbag round at the pit-bull as it began to bite at the muzzle of my shotgun. Deputy Nyhus was off to my right and had safe angle of fire. He fired several rounds from his handgun into the pit-bull, as I was chambering a second beanbag round in my shotgun. The pit-bull yelped several times and then expired.

Clayton came off the porch and was detained in the front yard by Deputy Freeman. Once the three occupants and the other pit-bull were safely detained away from the residence we made entry into the residence to serve the search warrant. No one else was found inside. I completed a secondary search for persons with Deputy Taddonio.

I collected the spent hull of my less lethal beanbag round for disposal after it was photographed in the front yard. I had no further involvement in this case.
